However, we made up for it on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> when 15 of you turned out to work the Woodland Path. This was our first attempt at repairing the path and it was a great success. Other August highlights included:

- identification of possible areas of the Allotment Wood where glades could be created. (there will be more on this at our committee meeting);
- clearance of the path through the orchard using the battery powered tools borrowed from the council's parks team;
- clearance of new growth Himalayan Balsam from the banks of the Malago.

All tools and equipment are provided.
- **3.** On **Friday 20 August**, a staff group from the University of Bristol will spend the day with us in Manor Woods Valley working on the Valley Heights Wildflower Meadow.
- **4.** Finally, we hope to see the return of the GoodGym runners on **Saturday 28 September** after a summer break.
